World Union For Progressive Judaism in Moscow

When is a conference more than a conference? When it is held in Moscow! Ayelet Tours has been coordinating conferences for over 15 years, some as large as 6,000 people. How hard could a 400 person meeting in Moscow be? We were about to find out...

A MONUMENTAL TASK

In June 2004, having already designated Moscow as host city, and chosen a host hotel, the World Union of Progressive Judaism (WUPJ) contacted Ayelet Tours for logistical assistance in what would be a monumental conference – the WUPJ's 32nd Biennial in Moscow. Monumental in that it would celebrate 15 years of Progressive Judaism in Russia with the first large-scale meeting by a Jewish movement ever to be held in Moscow.

From our perspective, it was also monumental in the logistical mountain to be scaled to run such an

event. There were forms to fill out, bureaucracy to overcome, and visa applications to process – one at a time. By Russian law, anyone requesting a Visa must show proof of secured accommodations – that meant a personalized letter of invitation for the specific dates of travel from the hotel for each and every traveler. Change your dates? You'll need a new visa and a new invite letter! This is just one of the many interesting challenges we helped the WUPJ address

in planning the meeting. Other challenges included coordinating concurrent pre-tours to Prague & Budapest, Warsaw & Krakow, and Kiev & Odessa for close to 100 participants – all of whom arrived in Moscow glowing from their remarkable experiences.

OUTSTANDING TURNOUT

All told, 485 participants from 23 countries came together in Moscow to further their vision for Progressive Judaism. The group focused on the theme of Community – the need for vision within a community, the necessity to build leadership for these communities and the goal of having these communities work together to move forward. Empowerment of Youth within the movement was also emphasized.

The conference ended an unquestionable success. In the words of one participant "I don't think Moscow will ever be the same!"

Certainly not for those that participated in the conference. Participants made friends, created bonds and learned from the experiences of other Progressive communities around the world. Our heartfelt thanks to the WUPJ for having the vision to bring us all together in such a unique place, and also for choosing to work with Ayelet Tours – it was an honor to be a key part of such an important event.

The Traveling University: Professor Stephen M. Berk

Dear Friends:

Ayelet Tours' Traveling University is embarking on five Jewish Heritage tours in 2006. The first will cover a broad overview of **Ireland** and Irish history and the rarely noted role that the local Jewish population has had in shaping this country. Former President of the State of Israel, Chaim Herzog was born in Ireland!

The second tour is a Jewish history tour of the **Balkans**. This area is coming back to life after the devastating breakup of the former Yugoslavia in 1991. In **Dubrovnik** we will visit the second oldest synagogue in the world and in **Slovenia** one of the newest, built in 2003. This will be a fascinating excursion into a relatively unknown area of Jewish history.

The third tour is a return to one of our most popular destinations, **Eastern Europe**. We will again visit **Warsaw**, **Krakow**, **Budapest and Prague**. This is a unique and outstanding experience that once again demonstrates that to understand our future, we must return to our past.

Ayelet Tours' Traveling University then takes us to the **Baltics & Bialystok**. This trip is a natural sequel to our Eastern European tour. We visit beautiful Riga in Latvia before continuing to Vilnius, Lithuania home of the famous Vilna Gaon. In Poland we tour Bialystok and see the Tykocin baroque synagogue built in 1642. Our journey ends in Warsaw where we learn about hundreds of years of Jewish history and meet members of Warsaw's vibrant new Progressive community. Our 2006 season finishes with our November tour to **Eastern Europe**.
